The Mesa Police Department was the first law enforcement agency in Maricopa County to offer convenient "drop off" locations for unwanted prescription drugs. Now the following Mesa Police Stations are equipped with Med Return boxes in their lobbies: unwanted prescription medications, vitamins, over-the-counter medications, pet medications, etc. can be dropped in these boxes during business hours, 8:00 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday.


